The Beginning...

How could we connect parents with those who make decisions about the services they and their children use? The idea of coproduction has been around for a while but how do we make that truly work for A Better Start Southend? As SAVS (Southend Association for Voluntary Services) are responsible for parent engagement they decided to see if they could interest parents in a voluntary role within the project. The creation of the Parent Champions seemed a natural step; let's give them some training, build their confidence, support them and give them a voice at meetings. No one quite knew how they would evolve, but yes, they were being noticed and people began to listen and so their coproduction story began.

The Training...

The Parent Champion training was an opportunity for parents to learn something new, but what parents didn't anticipate was that they would also learn something new about themselves. Their training would teach them understanding of the voluntary sector and would show them how to build their social skills when in a room full of strangers. They would learn how to be comfortable in their own skin and how to make others feel welcome too. The Parent Champions work on lots of layers and have no expectations put upon them, all that they do is because they want to be there; to be part of the conversations, whether that is at an engagement event with other parents or at a meeting with local business partners and research teams. They are community minded, they are the parents' voice and they want to be part of the positive change that could bring better local services, facilities, support and structure to families in the A Better Start Southend wards and beyond.
